Minimum Essential Standard of Living

 VPSJ has conducted Consensual Budget Standards research since 2004

Two parts to the research:

- Expenditure required for a Minimum Essential Standard of Living (MESL) which meets physical, psychological and social needs.
- 2. Income needed to afford the expenditure Minimum Income Standard (MIS)

Standard which no one should be expected to live below

Emphasis is on needs &

not wants


















Cost is based on actual price of detailed basket of over 2,000 goods & services




Single Adult MESL Expenditure Need






Salary per week, by hours of NMW employment



Single Adult – NMW & Social Welfare




One Parent & One Child




Social Welfare Supports by Age of Child




One Parent & Primary School (Under 7)
