




#### Weekly MIS versus Income Standards (1)




### Weekly Core Expenditure versus Income Standards (1)

#### Weekly Core Expenditure versus Income Standards (2)




#### Sources

- Household core expenditure (from Living Wage paper, based in turn on MEBS, e.g. www.budgeting.ie, www.misc.ie);
- Net incomes on wages calculated on Deloitte's tax calculator (<a href="http://deloitte.ie/tc/">http://deloitte.ie/tc/</a>)
- Minimum wage (39 hours/week). Gross = €17,542.20, Net = €16,787.00
- http://www.citizensinformation.ie
  - Child Benefit = €130/month/child = €1,560/year = €30/week (52 weeks)
  - One Parent Family Payment (taxable). Gross = €188/week + €29.80/week/child. (NB stops after age 7)
- www.cso.ie
  - Average weekly earnings (Qtr 3, 2013) Gross = €675.53/week. Net = €533/week.
  - Poverty line 60% median income (equivalised, individual) = €10,889/person adult + 0.66%/QA + 0.33%/QC (See e.g. SILC 2011)
- Basic income example, €10,000/year = €192.31/w
- Living Wage. Gross = €27,000. Net = €22,611/year or €435/week
- NOTE: charts drawn by hand and not precise in fine detail
